

Traveling the Wilderness: Stories of Faith

Midweek Lenten Series Theme

Lent is a time to refocus our dependence on God and on the community God gives us to grow. "Traveling the Wilderness: Stories of Faith" is our six-week Lenten Worship Series to practice trusting God in the ups and downs of life, and to grow deeper as a Christian community.

Our worship includes the story of Moses and the wilderness, retold through our Bible Drama entitled "Into the Wilderness and Beyond." It's a story of learning to trust and depend on God. We'll be studying the story of Moses every year in worship, so come and learn the story!

We'll pray in worship: silently around the altar, and together during the Lord's Prayer, which has been sung in our congregation for many years during our Lenten Midweek worship.

Lenten Practices in our Faith Community

<u>Meals:</u> During Lent, we eat together on Wednesday evenings. In this day and age, it's countercultural to sit around a table and eat with people you love and/or appreciate! Sign up in our church bulletin and let us know you'll be joining us for our 6pm Lenten Meals; suggested donation of \$5/person. Practicing caring for our earth as well, and bring your dishes to use during the meal.

<u>Giving:</u> During Lent, we practice giving to things that are important to us. Proceeds from our Lenten meals will be given to support our Adult Mission Trips. This year, we served people in the Hopeful, GA area who are recovering from hurricane and tornado damage.

Individual Devotions: During Lent, you are encouraged to begin/renew a weekly or daily prayer and meditation practice. We have free devotional guides you can use during Lent, located in our Narthex area. We also have a weekly email guide based on weekend worship readings, written by Pastor Jen. About Deacon Sue E. Rothmeyer

Deacon Sue E. Rothmeyer was elected Aug. 9, 2019, to a six-year term as secretary of the ELCA by the Churchwide Assembly in Milwaukee.

Secretary Rothmeyer began her ministry as a lay campus minister with Lutheran Campus Ministry at Iowa State University in 1984. With her passion for campus ministry, Secretary Rothmeyer continued her work at the churchwide organization in 1995. Before transitioning to the Office of the Secretary in her role as assistant to the secretary and executive for Office of the Secretary administration in 2012, Secretary Rothmeyer served in various positions in youth, young adult and campus ministry. She is the first deacon and first woman to serve as secretary of the ELCA.

Secretary Rothmeyer earned a Master of Arts in communication arts and rhetoric from the University of Wisconsin–Madison in 1984, and a Bachelor of Arts in English and speech communication from Luther College, Decorah, Iowa, in 1981. She serves as the ELCA representative to 1517 Media, Portico Benefit Services and Luther College Board of Regents; is a board member of Concordia Place in Chicago; and is a member of the National Association of Parliamentarians.



Winchester is a historic town where both bluegrass and Southern hospitality abound. They are also known for their Ale-8-One soft drink that dates to 1926, the only soft drink invented in Kentucky that is still around today. Group Workcamps has been in Winchester over 14 years ago. The hard work of those participants is remembered and, in fact, the reason we've been invited back. You will discover that although Winchester is a few short miles off the highway, they are not out of reach or out of touch. In this historic town and the surrounding rural countryside of rolling hills, residents just need a little help and hope.

How We'll Serve:

Some homes are in historic districts. Others are nearby in the rural surrounding hills. Projects will include construction of ramps and porches, trailer repairs, painting, and other repairs. Participants will stay in a facility that is *fully airconditioned and has indoor showers! There are 8 open showers for females and 12 open showers for males. If you're worried about modesty, bring your swimsuit. Everyone will be sleeping on floors, gender-separate, so bring your air mattresses!

The cost for this trip is \$400, plus money for meals on the road. Reserve your spot by signing up by May 1st. A \$50 nonrefundable deposit holds your spot. Scholarships are available - please contact Pastor Evan.

January 2020 Council Meeting Highlights

The State of St. John

Pastor Jen's review of 2019 included the following:

- The pastoral team feels the Narrative Lectionary enriches faith and the relationship it gives to everyday life.
- Lenten Worship was well received in 2019 and provides another avenue for faith growth.
- Pastor noted that Christmas and Easter attendance remains high and that these services often can provide an entry point for new members.
- The new communications position will enable the return of the Summer Faith Series which engages so many members.
- There will be a new Strategic Plan Working Group made up of Jonathan Adams, Tim Caldwell and Mark Frost. This group will manage the process for our 5year vision and invite ministry leaders to assist with vision implementation.

Pastor Robin reported the following highlights of the past year and expectations for the future:

- There are upcoming transitions due to Dawn MacGregor moving to the Communications position; the Food Pantry Director position will be evaluated to determine what tasks will move with Dawn and the focusing of the new Food Pantry Director position on ordering, staffing, etc.
- Pastor noted that we had a Blessing in November 2019 during worship for the current 14 Homebound Ministers.
- We had over 100 people signed up for small groups in the fall of 2019.
- 2019 began the Apostles' Creed Faith Milestone Ministry for 5th graders in Sunday School.
- Pastor noted that Sunday School attendance is a challenge; and they are working on ways to address the varying teacher schedules.

Pastor Evan reported:

- Since he arrived in June 2018 his work on the youth programs has moved beyond observation/learning and is now 'doing' – development and revision of programs.
- He is enjoying working with the staff and they motivate him to do his best work.
- Confirmation includes the Bible for this year's focus; letting the kids know they don't have to turn their brains off when they read the Bible and it's OK to ask questions. Campfirmation is a key part of our program and some of Pastor Evan's favorite moments in the year.
- High School Ministry has 20-30 attendees on a regular basis.
- Badger TEC (Teens Encounter Christ) retreat gives the youth an opportunity to deepen in faith.
- Forty-three (the most) kids participated in the mission trip to Rushville; the return trip dinner was a huge

- success with the kids and the congregation.
- College-Age Ministry [includes those in college, junior college and no college (working)] has begun; thirty care packages were sent; they are having check-ins at restaurants and are planning a college-age mission trip in June 2020.
- Young Adult Ministry [ages 25-35] has eight ministry team members visioning the ministry and is about to launch their first event.

Congregational Meeting Agenda 2020 Proposed Budget Outstanding Volunteers

At the Congregational Meeting that will be held January 26, the Congregation will vote to approve the proposed budget. In addition, the former Christian Education Committee members will be honored: Glenn Smith, Tessie Heath, Chris Markwell and Karen Norem. Over the past years, many of their duties had been reassigned to the administrative team, the Sunday School team, the pastors, and/or dropped. In order to best serve the church in those duties without redundancy, the team was dissolved in 2019. These volunteers will be recognized for their many faithful years of service.
