Eating Manna for Breakfast

Lately, I can't get the story of the Israelites and the wilderness out of my mind.

I've always relied on this story from Exodus when times seem a little unclear to me. A funny (not funny) thing happened to me again this month. As the days grew shorter, I found myself very sad about the pandemic; about the loss of life, the unrest and the madness that seems to be the way of humans these days. I found myself desperately wanting a sanctuary packed with several hundred people, raising the temperature in the room by 2-3 degrees with our shared singing and speaking our words of faith. I wanted our breath filling the air and enveloping the room as we navigate the big and small things of this world.

I miss that. A lot. It's not that I'm not grateful for what we have....you have been faithfully watching our worship videos, and we strive to make them an experience where you can connect with God. But still, not ideal. More than one thing can be true at once: I am grateful, and I miss what we don't have. Ironically, the very thing that makes us beautiful people of God also makes us exceedingly vulnerable. I've been noticing that, a lot. I'm also noticing that we humans— myself included— are tiring of enduring pandemic stuff. With good reason. At the very least, it's really messing up routines. At its worse, it causes death, anxiety and isolation, and being safe goes against the grain of how we connect with one another.

I believe the heart of the gospel is God's grace enveloping fragile humans, bringing new life and transformation out of our limitations and things we cannot control. It's one thing to say it, but things get hairier when you live through vulnerable times; when you can't see the ending of the story you are currently living.

I find this to be as true for us today as it was long ago. I think of the story of the in Exodus as I hear my own heart echoing the lament of the Israelites stuck in their own wilderness: "how can we endure this way, and how long will it be until we get to the other side of things?!?"

What will God do?

Good question. The stories in the Bible guide us in the way of faith, a way of wisdom which invites us to see our current situation in light of our God, whose vision goes beyond what we can see.

Take the Israelites, for instance. When in the wilderness, they would wake up, scrounge around for food to nourish them as they trod around, step by step, day after day, no end in sight. It was mind numbingly discouraging. They turned to Moses, asking him to fix the situation. Moses has no answer, so he turns to God and says: "This one is all yours, Big Guy." And then two miracles happen. The first: God listens to their prayers, even the snarky ones. The second: God gives them manna, a flaky substance— never before seen— appearing like dew on the ground every morning for their nourishment. Manna literally means, "what is this?!?" Answer: what they're having for breakfast. God instructs them about this particular breakfast, saying: "Here's your food. It expires in 24 hours, so you can't save it for the next day. You have to only eat what you need today, and trust tomorrow will take care of itself." When some

people try a way around the instructions and gather manna for more than a day, the stuff rots and is unfit to eat.

Manna: it's not what they had before. It's not what they want. It's difficult to endure it, day after day. But somehow, manna feeds them for the journey. For 40 years! That's 40 years of waking up and seeing manna on the ground, 40 years of taking it one day at a time, 40 years to practice trusting God will give them what they need for *that* day.

And so it is with us, I think, as we move forward in these next days. We are in the hard part of enduring. What I want this month is a packed sanctuary and loud singing and bumping into people. What we'll get is just enough to get us through, perhaps, until God gives us something more to chew on. I keep looking for the ways God is giving us little things, here and there, little ideas that make us wonder- "well, what is this?" In October, some drive-thru communion times so we can see each other's eyes. Perhaps your little bubble of people can watch worship, together. Maybe more, we have to get creative here — prayer stations in the parking lot? People showing up in Zoom rooms to tell us how their faith is getting them through "this" part of the journey?

What is God giving you today to endure?

Oh you lovely, beloved community of God, hear me say this: This too shall pass, I know it will. And we will be working to find ways to connect until then.

But if you ask me "When are we going to be able to do things like normal?" and I shrug my shoulders; know that it's not because I'm not thinking about it, praying about it, wondering about it and *longing* for it as well...

I'm just eating my manna for breakfast.
