Mwangaza Ministry Sunday

Sunday, December 8th

On Sunday, December 8th, we will welcome Daudi Msseemmaa, senior advisor for Mwangaza Education for Partnership in Tanzania, East Africa. Daudi and his wife Kellen also serve as ELCA missionaries, serving Global Missions as its East Africa representatives. Daudi will share his first-hand experience of the scope and need for Mwangaza's work during our sermon time and will lead a Q & A forum between worship services on December 8th.

St. John's long history with Tanzania began in the 1960's when longtime members Gerry and Marilyn Walters completed five years of volunteer work in Tanzania. Subsequently, in 1996, St. John hosted Tanzanian educator Elisante Nkini for two months as part of a new project called Mwangaza Education for Partnership. Following that, St. John member Jim Talarico re-joined Mr. Nkini in Tanzania as one of Mwangaza's first U.S. volunteer teachers, introducing new teaching strategies to Lutheran high school teachers nationwide and returning many times to continue that work.

Today, St. John member Debbie Kogelman continues that work as a teacher volunteer for Mwangaza, a grassroots, faith-based organization engaging participants in leadership development in all 26 dioceses of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Since its inception as a vehicle to improve secondary education in Lutheran secondary schools, it has expanded to programs for students, women leaders, and community members. St. John commits approximately \$3,500 a year towards Mwangaza through our Octoberfest fundraiser and General Budget.

The Longest Night...

- ...is another name for the Winter Solstice, the day with the shortest period of daylight, and the longest night of the year.
- ...is the name given to one unique worship service in December that invites us to grieve in a sacred space for losses that make *the holidays* difficult.
- ...is when the chaos of the day dissolves into a silent night of shadows and darkness that stretch longer, and deeper, than any other time.
- ...is when the voids in our lives open the widest, and befriend us in our darkness during everyone else's most wonderful time of the year.
- ...is when loneliness befriends us, and the holly on our own front is not a pretty sight.
- ...is when being numb has nothing to do with the snow and mistletoe, frosty snowmen, or a foggy Christmas Eve.
- ...is when your church family gathers together, to just be present with you during your grief.
- ...is a time to remember, process, and recognize the grief, sadness, and losses that loom within you for the first, or fiftieth, Christmas season.
- ...is on December 22nd at 7:00 p.m. at St. John.
- ...is an opportunity St. John gives you to converse if you feel like it, or sit quietly among others feeling as you do.
- ...is a welcome for you, the real you who keeps it together for reasons known only to you; the real you who holds both merry, and teary at the same time; the real you who puts one foot in front of the other, and walks the road to Bethlehem to see the infant Christ child.
- ...is a time for our pastors to offer you healing words, God's promises, and tissues too. They'll be there, waiting for you.

Helping Trees

We have two great opportunities to help others during this holiday season. Starting November 24th, there will be two giving trees located in the Narthex, the Salvation Army Angel Tree and the Giving Tree. Below are details on both opportunities.

Salvation Army Angel Tree

Each card will have the name of a specific child, their age and gender, and an identification code along with 2 gifts they would like to receive, plus their coat size.

St. John has committed to helping the Salvation Army by providing you the opportunity to pick one or more of the 100 Angel Tree tags

from the tree. If you are not able to afford everything (or something similar) that is on the tag, please get what you can or combine your efforts with another person or family to help a needy child.

Here's how it works:

- Pick a tag. Locate the Code # on the tag, and find the corresponding Code # on the clipboard located on the table by the tree. Write your name and phone number on the line next to your Code #.
- Return your unwrapped gifts in one sturdy box with the Angel Tree tag taped to it by Noon, Friday, December 13th. Place it under the same tree where you got the tag. DO NOT PUT GIFTS IN GIFT BAGS, if you would like to give gift bags to your child, please put the folded bags in the sturdy box.
- 3. We will deliver all gifts to the Salvation Army.

You will have a warm feeling in your heart and smile on your face knowing that a child has had a better Christmas because you cared!

Giving Tree

Our Giving Tree helps individuals and families that we serve in the community.

Although it is fun to shop for a gift for a child, families need so much more to survive day-to-day living; thus, we have created the opportunity for you to provide gift cards in \$10 increments to area stores and gas stations.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Take one or more tags and buy gift cards in \$10 increments from the store named on your tag(s).
- Return your gift cards to the church office during December.
- 3. Cards are given out throughout the year on an as needed basis by the pastors and church office staff.
- 4. Take comfort in knowing that you have helped a needy family put gas in their car, buy diapers for their baby, pay for needed medicine, buy needed clothing or other necessary items.

Dear St. John's Lutheran Church VBS,

Thank you for your generous gift of books for the Storybook Project at Statesville Correctional Center.

Each month, a team of volunteers digitally record prisoners reading books to their children and grandchildren. The recordings are placed on CDs, then the books and CDs are mailed to the children. The children enjoy listening to their fathers or grandfathers read a book to them.

When asked why they participate in Storybook, some of the men said:

I enjoy it and the kids love it. It may be a small token, but my children can hear my voice. Storybook is a beautiful thing. You never know what these books may do for a child!

It's good to read and to connect with your child.

I do it "so my kids know I care and am there to teach them how to read. I enjoy it. They enjoy it and I appreciate it."

I do it "so my son can know I care about him in a different way because I can't show him I love him. I think about him all the time."

Not only do the children and prisoners enjoy Storybook, the volunteers look forward to it knowing that they make a difference in the lives of the children and men they serve by sharing the love of Jesus.

In Matthew 25, Jesus says, "And the King will answer them, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.""

Thank you for letting us serve Him through your gift of books.

Gratitudes: I'm grateful for being part of people's lives during their milestones; I was able to spend time this month with many pastoral acts, ministering to people in times of sorrow and joy. I'm grateful for our creative and dedicated staff, who worked hard to launch our fall ministries. Their love of God and this church is evident in their daily work. I'm grateful for our studies on the Bible, and the people who are investing time and energy in God's Word. It was thrilling to be part of these conversations in New Member Class and in our Confirmation Leaders meeting this past month. I'm grateful for the people in our congregation who gave so much time and energy to raise money for our neighbors who come to our Food Pantry, especially Janel Eaton, who orchestrated a wonderful Hunger Action Month appeal. I'm grateful for our pastoral team, always, and the way we work together to serve God and the mission of our congregation.

Giving: Giving at the end of September was healthy! Our budget is in line with our expenses! MUCH GRATITUDE for the work we do, and the people who give their financial resources for our mission and ministry at St. John!

Stewardship Appeal: We kicked off our fall appeal on October 5-6th! I've been working with Dawn MacGregor and Pam Kornaus to launch the appeal. Every week in October, we'll focus on one area of ministry, and how our financial stewardship fuels our mission: *Sharing the Love of Christ*. Commitment Weekend is October 26-27, 2019.

Website: RELAUNCHED! Dawn MacGregor spent many hours these last weeks putting the final touches on our website so we could go live before our Stewardship Appeal- and the results are amazing! We hope people will use the website as a way to stay connected and to share

information about our faith community.

New Member Classes: We are grateful for the 10 families who are attending our four-week New Member Class. Please greet them during our coffee hour on October 20th, the day they will be received at our 11am worship.

Church Council- The Why and The How: One aspect of my work involves working with our Church Council to steward and lead our congregation's mission. What I've been working on this month:

Every month on our Council agenda, we talk about one or two items focusing on our stewardship of our congregation's mission: Sharing the Love of Christ. The Church Council works diligently on the how we steward the vision. This month: 2020 Budget, which begins with Staff and ministry leaders submitting their 2020 budget requests. Next, the Finance Committee will do some prework on the budget for the Council's consideration to forward to the congregation in January. The Council stewards our constitution on behalf of the congregation, always keeping in mind the best practices for our current faith community and the future faith community will we be in years to come. This includes defining the roles of council and staff. and what policies and procedures need to be in place so ministry is healthy and strong in our congregation for years to come.

Throughout the year, we also discuss the *why* of our mission. We've had discussions about St. John's values, and how God lives through this faith community to strengthen our faith. We look at cultural trends, and discuss our mission in a changing world. This month, we are taking a look at the past year so we can set goals for next year.

Church Growth: As I sat in our New Member Class, I heard again the stories of people who were feeling a tug to feed their spiritual life. I wonder: how many more unchurched people are yearning to feed their spiritual lives with steps to grow in faith? How do they know this faith community is gifted to respond? Who out there feels disenfranchised with church, or with the world, and is seeking a place where Christians are accepting and concerned with our troubled world, and working to make a difference as God calls us to do?

We are called to this mission. It involves us checking in with the "why" and the "how" of our daily ministry. What do we need? A few first steps: I'll be taking time in the next month to map out some times/places where we can gather to talk about the "why" of our mission. Other steps in process: Joining the online world. For instance, did you know that very often, before people visit a church, they check out the faith community online? This is why we relaunched our website. Another goal: support our communications to help people more easily interact with our congregation. The work here involves having someone manage our communications. This will help our staff team communicate more effectively with our members and with people who are seeking a church home. My work with the 2020 budget includes mapping out possibilities towards funding a fulltime staff member in communications. Another step: providing focus for our ministries which include topics and learnings to help people take steps to grow in faith. I'll be taking time the next few months to map out some ideas to discuss with staff and key ministry leaders as we look to our ministries in 2020.

Children's Ministries

Letters went out to parents of all 5th graders inviting kids to attend and learn about these words of our faith. Kids will receive a blessing in worship November 17.

Beautiful Beginnings – This ministry to parents and their babies/toddlers began a new 6-week session October 6, which meets during Sunday school. Gathering for games, songs, activities, and socialization, all parents of kids this age also receive a monthly age-appropriate email about the faith development of their child.

Sunday School Christmas Program – Starting costumes and getting kids signed up for speaking parts this month for this annual celebration and story-telling of Jesus' birth, which will be December 8th.

Homebound Communion – The Homebound Communion Team met to share the highs and lows of our ministry, plan for their blessing and recognition in worship November 10, and discuss other ways our ministry could serve our homebound members. I visited homebound members Bob and Jean Fitzer and a few other members who were hospitalized or at rehabilitation.

Continuing Ed – September 27-29 I received training and education on Advanced Directives, end of life decisions, funeral planning, burial

options, grief, and death with the intent of helping facilitate one's final wishes, as well as to provide comfort, lowering anxiety and fear when death is imminent.

Synod Council Visits – I visited the council meeting of New Life Lutheran Church, Bolingbrook, as a neighbor and representative of the synod to tell them about all the good work we do in our ELCA congregations, synods, and worldwide, and what a difference in the world our Mission Support dollars make. Did you know ELCA members donated \$1.8 billion in undesignated funds in 2017 to support the work we do at all these levels?? Did you know that the Northern IL Synod is the only remaining synod to send 55% of offerings to ELCA Churchwide ministry that are received from our synod congregations?? Amazing ©

- 3. The planning for young adult ministry will continue on Oct 24th as we reconvene to talk about our "one-to-one conversations" that we were trained to do in August. At this meeting, we will start to discuss what our purpose and mission should be.
- 4. I will be spending a good portion of this month on administration and organization so that I can be better prepared for our winter/spring season.
- 5. The new, collaboratively planned college-age mission trip is still on course to take place in the second week of June 2020. The planning group will be convening again in November, at which time concrete dates and prices will be decided. Stay tuned for more!
